Findings from the Baseline Community Survey

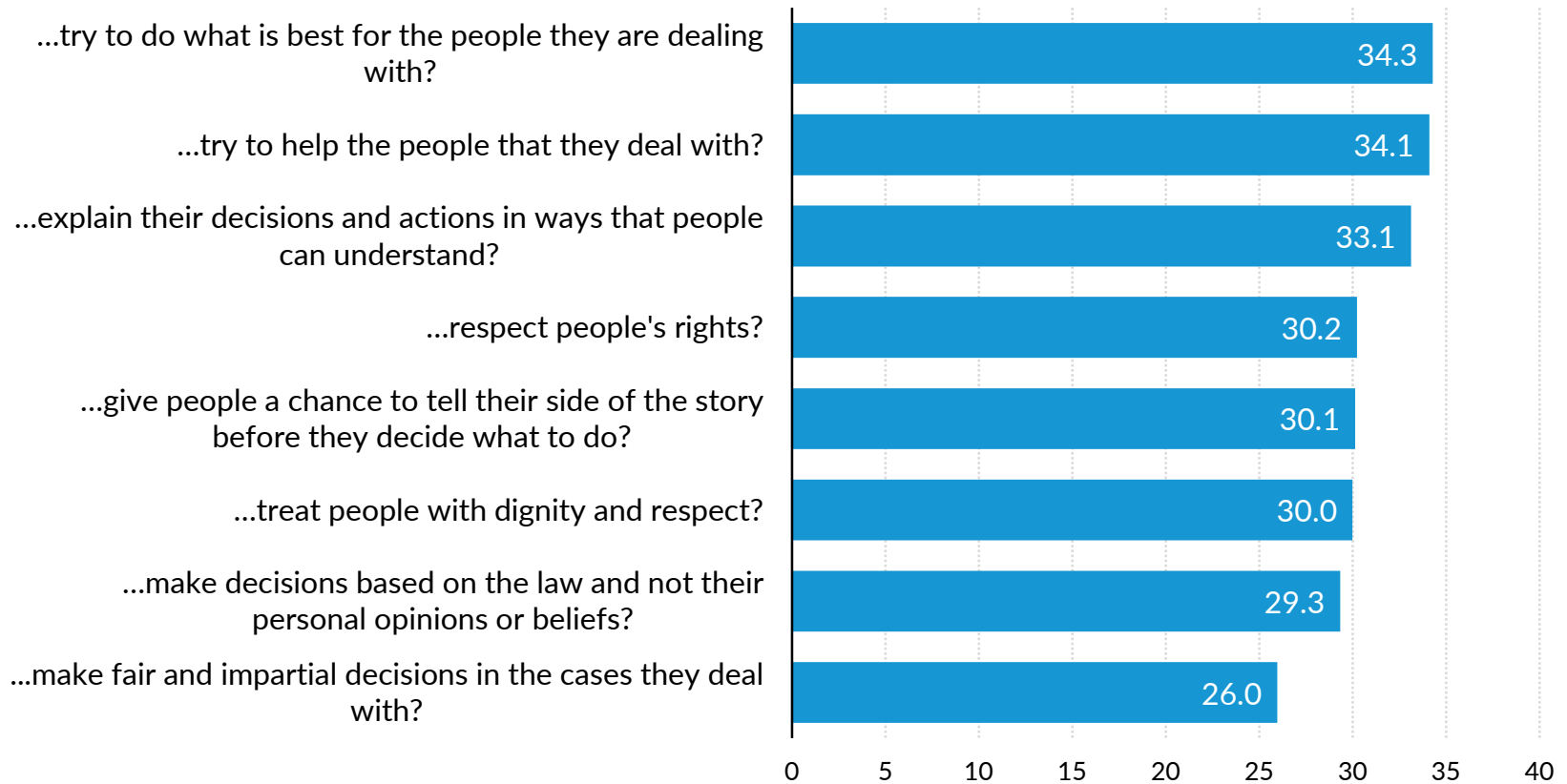
Respondents mostly people of color



Almost 2/3rds below federal poverty threshold of ~\$24k



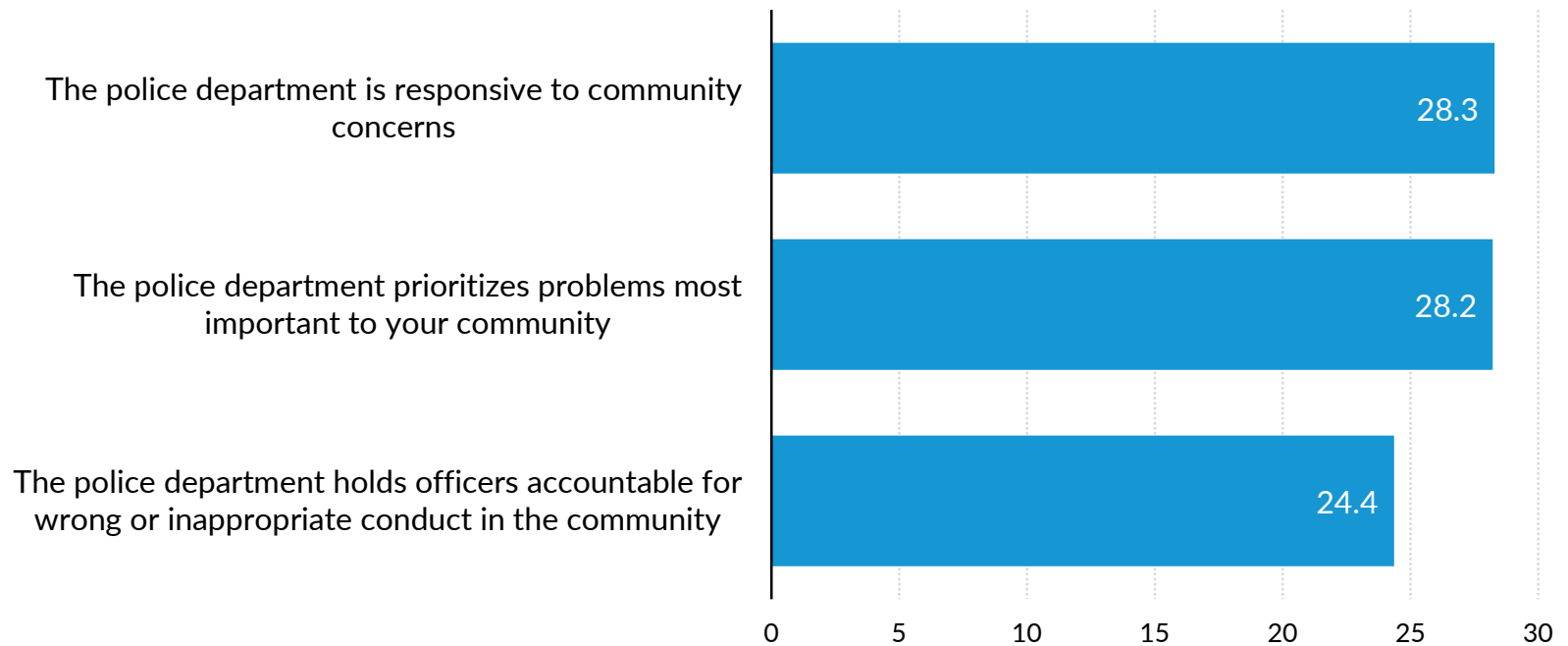
Low levels of perceived procedural justice



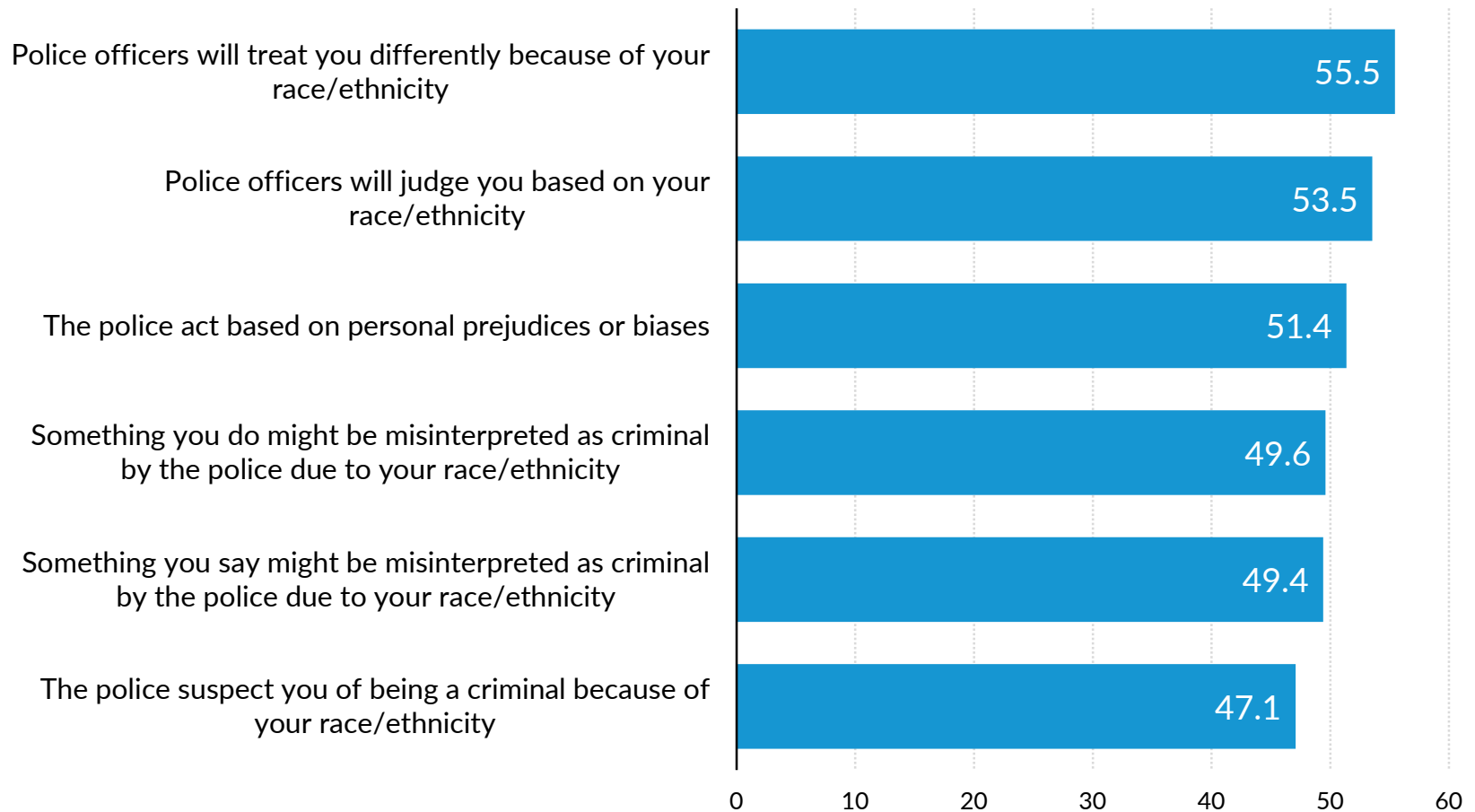
Lack of belief in legitimacy of department



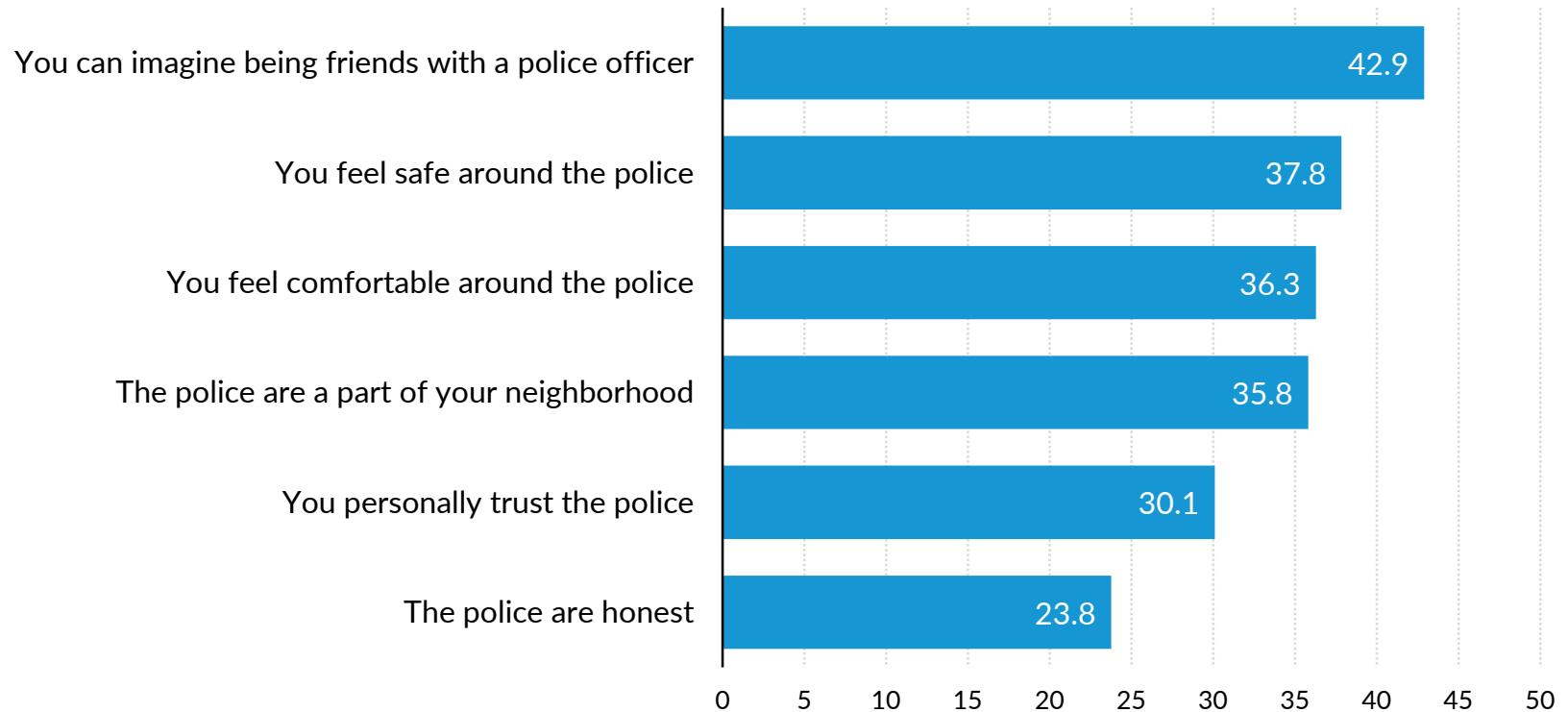
Misalignment with principles of community policing



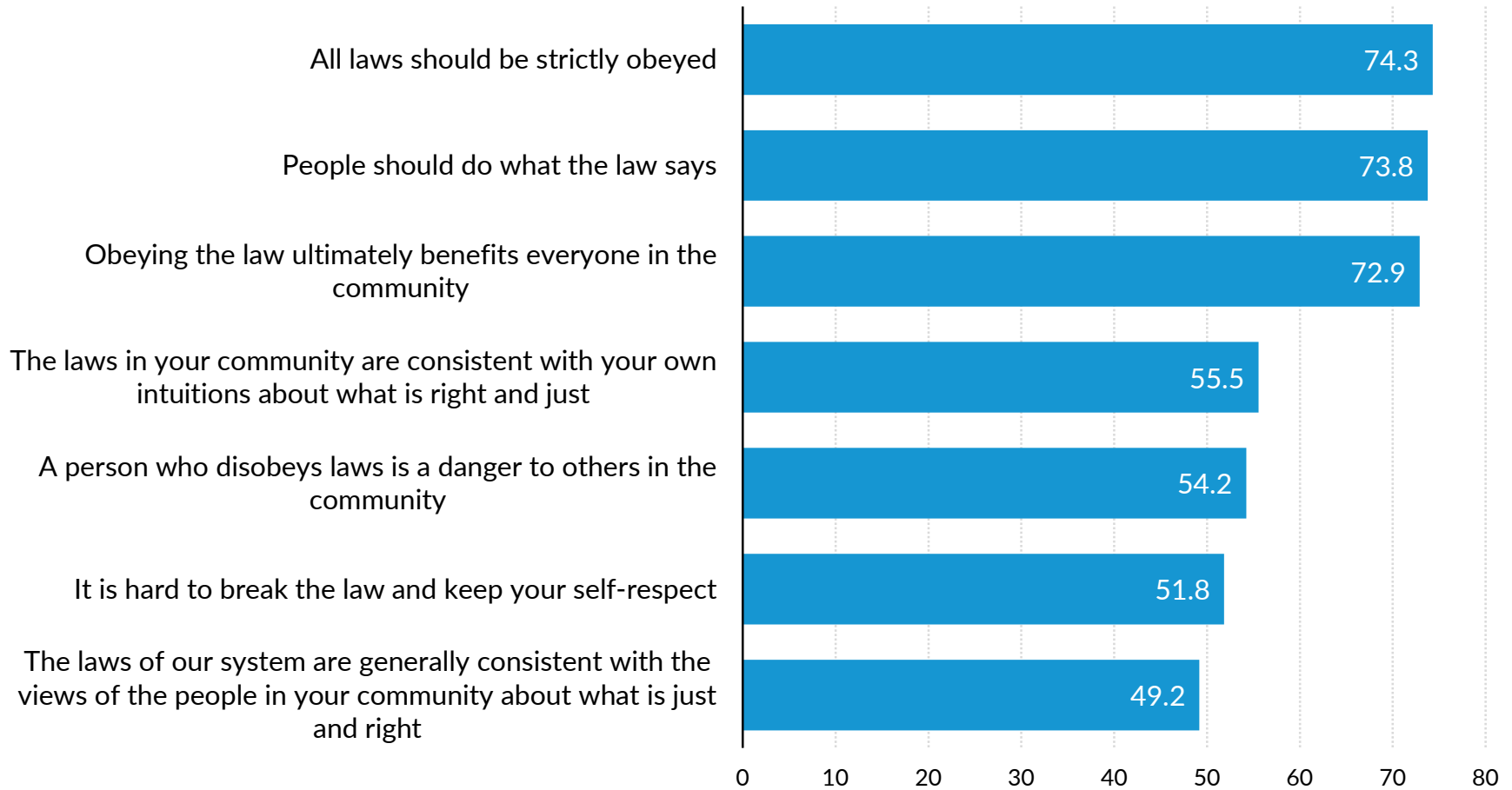
High degree of police bias



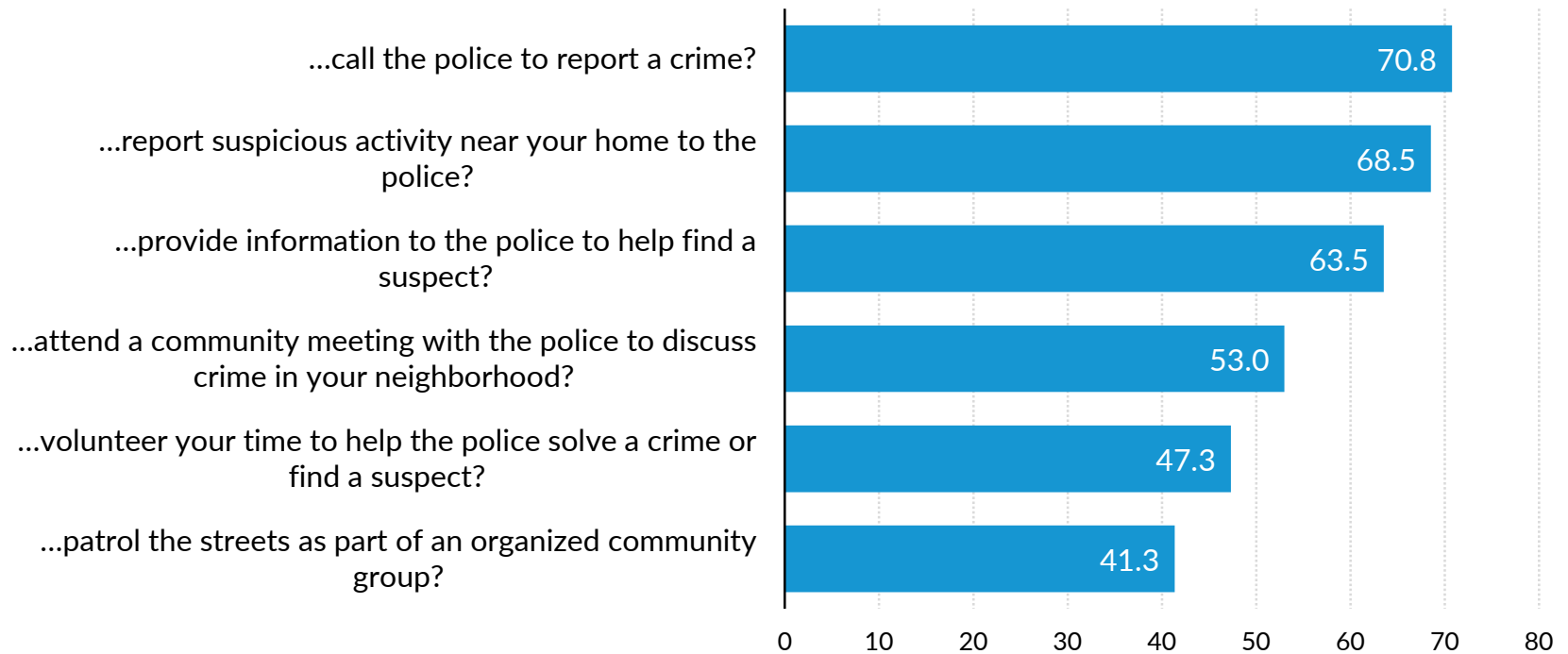
Mixed degree of relatability to police



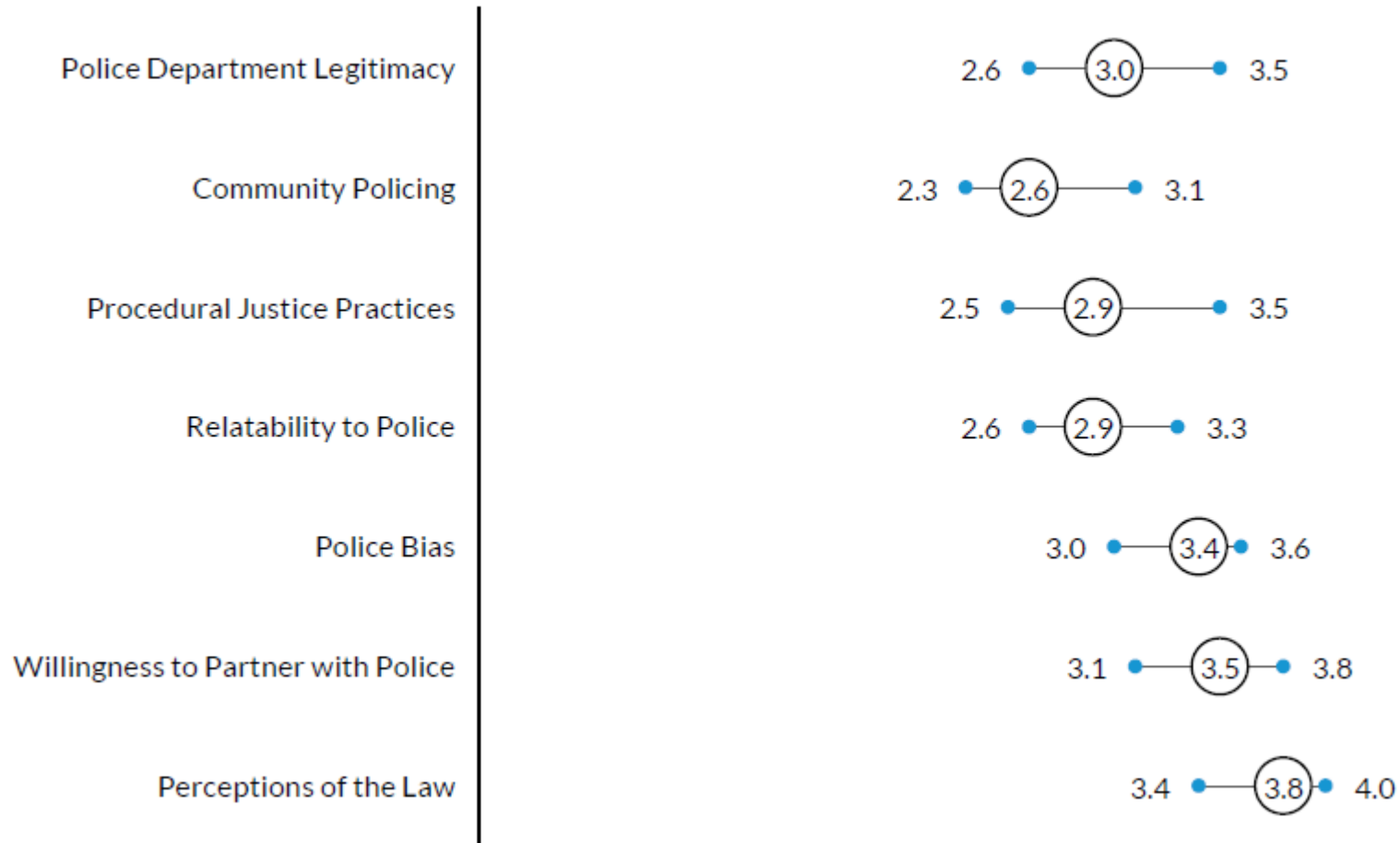
Strong belief in the law

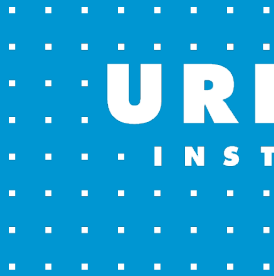


Willingness to partner with police
